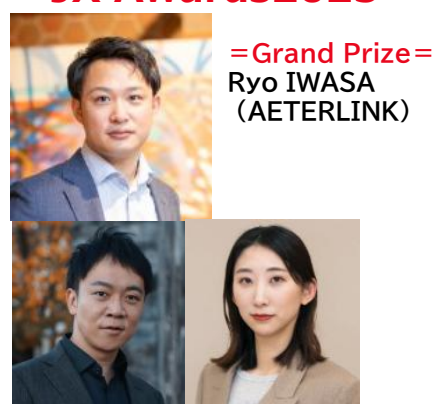

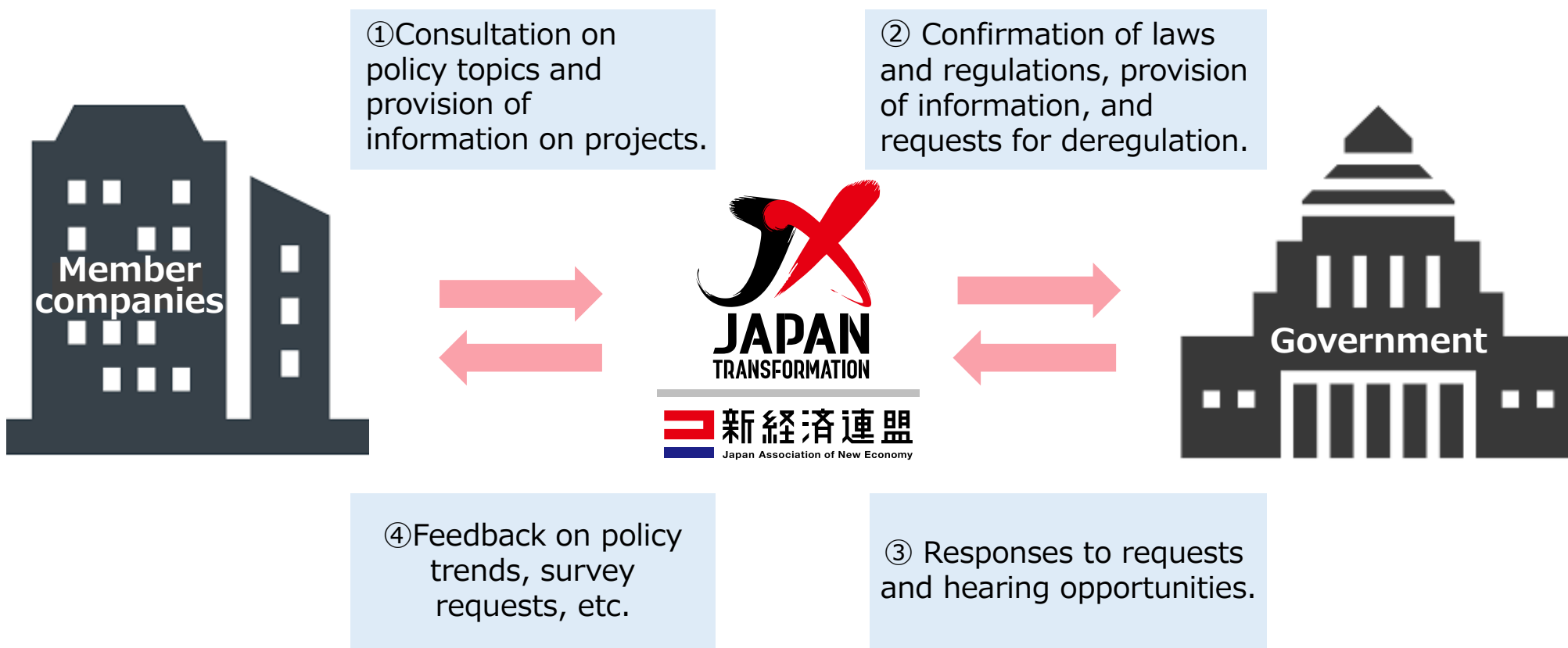

Basic policy philosophy of JANE

JAPAN TRANSFORMATION Change Japan Fundamentally

Make Japan a country where "people, knowledge, and money" gather from all over the world.

There is no future for this country unless we change Japan toward a new era with the power of entrepreneurs.

✓ Important Measures for realization of JAPAN TRANSFORMATION(JX)

1

Give more authority to the private sector

- The role of the government should be shaped according to this core principle.
- Foster a **philanthropic ecosystem** centered on private sector.

2

Reduce globally high tax rates

- Countries with high taxes will inevitably decline.
- **Prerequisite for any reform** necessary for JX.

3

Promote and use of "New Combination"

- "New combination" of all the connections that are fluidized by digitalization.
- **Create new value and improve productivity** through "new combination".

Policy Action Item (excerpts from the 10th Anniversary Policy Proposal)

① Drastic reduction in tax rates and elimination of Galapagos regulations in funding and business.

- In order to compete for global talent acquisition and attraction of company locations, drastic reduction of individual/corporate income taxation and inherit tax (e.g., maximum individual income tax rate from current 55% to 40%) and revision of departure tax.
- Revision to book value assessment taxation of tokens, including those held by third parties, and separate taxation of profits from crypto asset transactions.
- Removal of restrictions on the listing of class shares.
- Elimination of Galapagos regulations such as those that hinder inbound tourism (e.g., restrictions on heli-skiing and water cottages).
- Elimination of restrictions on C2C businesses such as ride-sharing and minpaku stays.
- Conduct a collective review of the necessity and effectiveness of all the individual "business laws".

☞ **Companies can create and develop global businesses on a level playing field.**

② Enact a "Basic Immigration Act" and establish an employment system of attracting people from the world.

- Clarification of the principles for accepting foreign nationals by enactment of the Basic Immigration Act and abolition of the technical internship system.
- Introduction and thorough enforcement of rules for starting and ending employment based on job descriptions, which is normal outside of Japan.
- Abolition of systems based on the "breadwinner of the family," such as the spousal deduction.
- Establishment of a social insurance/labor system that facilitates freelance and other forms of work other than "employment".

☞ **Individuals can get opportunities of new job, job change, and job assignment of their choice and demonstrate their abilities in jobs required in the digital age.**

☞ **Companies are able to utilize diverse and highly engaged human resources in the right place and at the right time.**

③ Promote reform competition among local governments and foster a philanthropic ecosystem

- Establishment of government system that promotes reform and competition among local governments with the *doshu* system as one option, and thorough national standardization of data infrastructure.
- Drastic tax reduce and social security spending reform, reform of the public interest corporation system and the donation tax system in an integrated manner, and creation of new money flow through the "private" sector playing a "public" role (e.g., venture philanthropy).
- Recruitment and assignment of highly specialized human resources, and legalization of the EBPM principle in the government.
- Abolishing the lifetime employment system for each ministry, which leads to bureaucrats becoming a resistant force tied to vested interests.
- Adopting the common law approach and avoiding "pre-emptive regulations" through codification.

☞ **Enables efficient government for evidence-based, pro-business responses in an agile manner.**

④ Break away from an educational style that accumulates individual knowledge and strengthen "LEEDF" education on a broad base

- L: Leadership/E: Education/E: Entrepreneurs/D: Digital/F: Financial education– strengthen those in elementary, secondary, and higher education.
- Expanding the number of faculty members with business experience, increasing the students in information related departments and curriculum reform in the university to respond to the digital age.

☞ **Enables individuals to acquire the ability to think for themselves and live in the digital age.**

⑤ Regulatory and taxation systems reforms to ensure digitalization in preparation for the Web3 era

- Enactment of the "Comprehensive Act for the Promotion of the Formation of Web3 Society" to collectively reform regulations and taxation systems that hinder the development and spread of blockchain/NFT.
- Revision of the "Basic Act for the Formation of a Digital Society" to clearly state the principles of complete digitization of all procedures in the public and private sectors, realization of a "zero-cash society" by 2030, and opening of APIs.
- Introduction of regulations prohibiting acts that impede competition and fee regulations focused on OS/applications stores.

☞ **Enabling "new combination" of connections throughout society that creates new value, not mere efficiency.**

Carbon Neutral WG

- Launched in April 2022 as a platform for information sharing and discussion among JANE members. This is in response to the global trend of promoting carbon neutrality and the increasing number of companies in Japan that are working on management and business development that respond to a decarbonized society, and the increasing level of climate change response required of companies regardless of their size.
- In its 4th year (FY2025), the existing committees and subcommittees were reorganized, and activities began under five newly established committees: the EV Promotion Committee, the Sustainability Promotion Committee, the Institutional Innovation Committee, the GX Human Resources Development Committee, and the Consumer Behavior Change Committee.

Next Generation Education WG

- With growing interest in entrepreneurship education, STEAM education, and Digital Transformation(DX) in education to nurture the next generation of human resources, a new "Next Generation Education WG" has been established under the existing Education Reform PT (June 2023).
- Discussions are currently focused on promoting entrepreneurship education and industrial human resource development, strategies for the utilization of educational data, advancing the AI Utilization, and promoting school affairs DX.
- Going forward, based on the published policy recommendations, we will discuss measures to integrate high-quality entrepreneurship education into schools and accelerate educational DX.
- 28 member companies participate in the WG (As of July 2025).



<Recent activities>

- Hold a WG meeting once every three months.
- Presentations on next-generation education by member companies and exchange opinions with related ministries and educational organizations.
- Based on the discussions in the WG, we released the revised 'Policy Recommendations for Realizing Next-Generation Education, Ver. 2,' which builds on and further develops the recommendations announced last year.
- Event were held focused on entrepreneurship, inviting leading experts engaged in cutting-edge work in policy, research, and practice, to provide learning opportunities

AI Community

- With the rapid spread of AI in society, triggered by the emergence of AI technology, the purpose of this forum is to share and accumulate AI-related application cases and the latest policy trends through the sharing of AI development and utilization cases as well as to building relationships among member companies to create various synergy effects.
- Generally held monthly since its establishment in November 2023. As of July 2025, 56 companies have participated.
- The members present examples of AI utilization and development (business efficiency improvement, new business study, LLM development, etc.), and findings and challenges obtained through AI utilization in practice. Seminars on policy trends by experts and government officials are also scheduled.

DE&I Community

- Established a DE&I (diversity, equity, and inclusion) community to lead discussions on promoting social diversity and economic development. The goal is to implement measures necessary to innovate society and promote the active participation of diverse talent, including women and foreign nationals.
- Generally held monthly since its establishment in January 2025. As of July 2025, 28 companies have participated.
- Members will present their DE&I initiatives and best practices. In the first year, discussions will focus on themes such as "female empowerment in the business world," "fostering female digital talent and CTO/CISO," and "hiring foreign nationals and cross culture inclusion within companies."
- Through hearings with relevant government experts, the latest policy trends will be discussed. From the perspective of private companies actively engaging in DE&I, discussions will be held on the necessary measures to promote DE&I in Japan.

Golf tournaments and mahjong tournaments for the purpose of developing relationships among member companies. A "practical education course" offered to corporate managers and executives, as well as those who are seeking to start their own businesses. Specific theme is set each time and experts in various fields are invited to give lectures. The lecture is held 3 to 5 times each year. The first seminar in 2021 focuses on security theory, while the second seminar in 2022 focuses on organizational management theory.

A highly popular practical course for those in the PR and IR departments. Held multiple times a year, it covers everything from the basics to advanced PR techniques, including press release writing and media relations. In FY2023, we held study sessions on international trends, where outside experts provide commentary on hot topics in overseas legal and regulatory trends relevant to our policy recommendations, including non-financial information disclosure (8th session), crypto asset regulations in major countries (7th session), and the introduction of OECD Pillar 2 (6th session), lobbying trends and recent tech policy issues in the EU (5th session).

■ Media MeetUp!



This is a networking event with the media for PR professionals from member companies. It is an opportunity to speak directly with leading media representatives about recent topics of interest and behind-the-scenes stories. The first event was held in February 2024 and will be held regularly.

■ Art Action Forum
